DESCRIPTION OF FINDINGS & CONCLUSIONS

This renewal inspection involved a review of all applicable child care center administrative rules and statutes. Verification of compliance included direct observations of the physical environment and the program, discussions with staff, and a review of the center's records, including staff records and children's records. Staff records include background checks and training information. Children's records include child information cards, physical examination dates, and immunizations.

During my on-site inspection I observed arrival, free play, diapering, feedings, morning snack, group times, outdoor time, lunch, and rest time. The classrooms were clean and organized. Materials and equipment were in good condition and available to children. Ratios were maintained and caregivers provided appropriate care and supervision for the children in care. I observed caregivers interacting with children in positive and nurturing ways; sitting on the floor or chairs to be on the

child's level, making eye contact, listening and talking to children, using positive discipline techniques. Group times were developmentally appropriate and children seemed to be engaged. Sanitization and handwashing requirements were followed by caregivers and children. Center records were organized and readily available.

I provided technical assistance and consultation on handwashing, child records, capacity, and upcoming law changes.

The outdoor play area was snow covered and I was not able to fully assess compliance. The playground equipment that I inspected was in good condition.

During the inspection, the center was found to be in compliance with all applicable rules and statutes except for the following violations:

R 400.8176 Sleeping equipment.

(10) Soft objects, bumper pads, stuffed toys, blankets, quilts, comforters, and other objects that could smother a child shall not be placed in a crib or porta-crib with a resting or sleeping infant.

Two infants over the age of two months were observed swaddled and asleep:

- The first infant was swaddled and asleep in the crib
- The second infant was swaddled and asleep in a bouncy seat

I provided technical assistance to the caregiver in the room. I will make a follow up inspection within three months.

R 400.8188 Sleeping, resting, and supervision.

(11) Infants and toddlers who fall asleep in a space that is not approved for sleeping shall be moved to approved sleep equipment appropriate for their age and size.

Upon entering one of the infant classrooms I observed an infant asleep and swaddled in a bouncy seat.

I provided technical assistance to the caregiver in the room. I will make a follow up inspection within three months.

R 400.8330 Food services and nutrition generally.

(22) Staff shall foster and facilitate toddlers' independence, language, and social interactions by doing all of the following:
(c) Sitting and eating with toddlers during meal times.

Toddler caregivers were standing as children ate their morning snack and lunch. I provided technical assistance to Ms. Andree concerning the rule requirements.

R 400.8340 Food services and nutrition; provided by parents.

(3) Breast milk, formula, milk, other beverages, and food furnished in a same-day supply shall be covered and labeled with the child's first and last name and the date.

- In the infant rooms there were a few bottles that did not include the date on the label.
- In the other classrooms the lunchboxes were labeled with children's full names but did not include dates.

I provided technical assistance and consultation on dating food provided by parents.

Corrective Action Plan Dated July 2, 21016**

A corrective action plan was requested and approved on 02/07/2018. It is expected that the corrective action plan be implemented within the specified time frames as outlined in the approved plan. A follow-up evaluation may be made to verify compliance. Should the corrections not be implemented in the specified time, it may be necessary to reevaluate the status of your license.

III. RECOMMENDATION

I recommend issuance of a regular license to this child care center.
