This policy was not followed.	Ms. Janice Ervay will go over the accident and incident reports and correct them so they are much clearer as to when they will be reported to parents. Once the plans are corrected in the handbook they will be followed as written. R 400.8143 (3)(c)	During my onsite inspection I observed a couple of children pet the dogs at the child care center, their caregivers did not have them wash their hands after doing so.	Ms. Janice Ervay will remind staff that children must wash their hands after touching any animals.	Immediately
R 400.8167 (1)(a) Indoor Space	The preschool/school age classroom has a max capacity of 15 preschool age children and older. This is based on the square foot requirement of 35 square feet per child. Ms. Janice Ervay reported that on occasion there will be 22 to 23 children all age ranges in the room during a meal.	Ms. Janice Ervay will immediately make sure that we are in capacity at all times, including meal times. We will serve the younger children in their rooms, when ratio and capacity cannot be met.	Immediately
R 400.8125 (1)	Although it was not Ms. Amanda Ervay intent to drop Child F, she did not secure the child to her when taking her from another caregiver. When picking up any child appropriate care should be taken to insure the child is not dropped during the transition.	Ms. Janice Ervay will conduct a meeting immediately and will discuss the importance of safely taking a child from another provider and making sure a secure grip is on the child. Janice will watch to make sure correct handling of children is being done.	Immediately
R 400.8125 (1)	Ms. Janice Ervay and Ms. Amanda Ervay did not provide appropriate supervision to Child D when they left him inside the child care center alone.	To make sure that appropriate care and supervision is provided we will call on a cell phone when we need another provider, instead of walking out to exchange places while a child is sleeping.	Immediately

R 400.8140 (1)	The caregivers did not utilize positive disciplines methods when they instructed a child to stand with their face against the wall and their nose touching the wall.	We will use redirecting for the younger children and if that doesn't work we will try and talk with them and get them interested in a different toy or story. The older children above the age of 3 we will talk with them and encourage them to work the problem out with the other person and hopefully be able to learn to solve their problems. If that doesn't work they will be directed to a quiet time for the length of their age or less and encourage them to come up with a solution. The children will not be required to face the wall or put their nose on the wall. Then we will talk with them about how to solve problems.	Immediately
R 400.8182 (8) Ratio and group size requirement	During my onsite inspection I observed nine children being cared for by two caregivers, the youngest child in the group was an infant. This would require a 1:4 ratio.	Ms. Janice Ervay will keep a better eye on the children that are in the preschool room as the children are waking up from naps to insure that we are not out of ratio.	Immediately
R 400.8158 (2) Incident, accident, injury, illness, death and fire reporting	The child care center did not notifying the department that Child F received medical attention after sustaining a fall at the child care center.	Ms. Janice Ervay will make sure to call and notify licensing, if any child is taken for medical treatment or hospitalized.	Immediately
R 400.8158 (3) Incident, accident, injury, illness, death and fire reporting	The child care center did not submit a written report to the department notifying the medical attention Child F received after sustaining a fall at the child care center.	An incident report will be filled out and sent to the licensing consultant with in the 72 hour period.	Immediately
